We appointed César as lunchtime assistant and ESO and he has done a great job encouraging more spoken Manx at lunchtimes.

Trips and events included

A Y5 and 6 visit QE2 to let the children find out more about the Manx lessons available there and to see how the school runs.

Y1 and 2 had a trip to the Wildlife Park looking at habitats.

Reception class went to the Wildlife Park looking at camouflage.

Skipping and Zumba for the whole school which along with regular running and dance sessions enable the children to keep active and wake their brains up.

First Aid and Crucial Crew for the older children learning about the emergency services and how to keep themselves and others safe.

We had a series of tennis lessons for the children in Mnr Cain's class along with a series chess lessons.

Y3 and 4 went out for a bird watching trip with Manx birdlife, stressing the importance of habitats and looking after spaces where wildlife can live.

Lempen Puppet Theatre came to do a show about friendship and the changing climate, Lots to think about there.

Brastyl Sniaull walked to Peel along the railway line for Earth day and the whole school took part in sponsored walks, one up Slieau Whallian and the other to the shelter at the Arboretum.

The oven Mr and Mrs Pettit bought for us was installed and we are now able to do cookery lessons in the staff room with groups of children with much better results than we got from our baby belling ovens.

Bnr O'Meara returned to 4 days a week after easing in gently after maternity leave and now shares her role with Bnr Hampton who was appointed after Easter.

Over the year we worked hard on the school garden and made some changes and thanks to one of our dads who enlisted the help of a group of visiting bikers staying next door, we got two sheds hefted over the fence into the garden space for gardening and science activities. Thanks Mnr Quayle.

We sold books for World Book Day and over the year from different events, the biggest of which was the sponsored walk, raised over £1700 for the crisis in the Ukraine.

Mnr Maddrell built a space shuttle in Class 2 which was a great hit and added to the experiences for that term's topic.

SnyP as active as usual organised many events over the year ,starting with a Hop tu Naa disco followed by a Christmas Fair a Valentines disco and end of year ice cream for everyone as well as an end of year disco. We had sports successes in hockey, football, cross country and a fun sports day on the fair field.

We had a great day when we welcomed back past pupils and their parents to help us celebrate 20 years of the Bunscoill. Wow has it really been that long! It was fantastic to see so many familiar faces gracing our doors once again.

We also had a picnic for the Manx speaking community as part of our 20 year celebrations
